



This 'Dear John' exhibition has been specially commissioned for Listowel Writers' Week 2021. 'Dear John' is MacMonagle's imagined responses from twenty famous or infamous people including Vladimir Putin, the Dalai Lama, Melania Trump, Pope Francis, Boris Johnson and Meghan Markle. Poetry Pamphlets have never been more popular. Often viewed as a rite of passage for poets, pamphlets are increasingly becoming important and singular publications in their own right.

Join Sarah, Tom and Victoria in this lively, fun and informative event as they discuss the joys, frustrations and pitfalls of putting a poetry pamphlet together. They will offer unique insights into the process of selecting, editing and submitting poetry pamphlets for publication and how Sarah and Tom worked together to create Tom Moore's stunning pamphlet *Brother Adam* (The Well Review, 2020).

As editor and founder of The Well Review, Sarah is accepting submissions for new pamphlets during the month of June so this is a golden opportunity to hear her advice to poets who want to try their hand at this rebellious, exciting and essential form. So dust off that manuscript and prepare to discover everything you wanted to know about poetry pamphlets but were too afraid to ask!



Sarah Byrne is a writer and editor from Co. Cork. She is a graduate of Trinity College Dublin, the University of Cambridge & the University of Oxford where she studied German literature, criminology and creative writing. Sarah worked for human rights organisations, charities and psychiatric research institutes for eight years before becoming a full-time editor. She founded The Well Review literary journal in 2016 which has featured Anne Carson, Paul Muldoon and Ellen Bass. The Well Review Pamphlet series was launched in 2020 with Tom Moore's *Brother Adam*. The pamphlet submission window will run from June 1st - 30th in 2021, www.thewellreview.com





Tom Moore is from Cork and is an academic and scientist at UCC, where he directs the BSc Genetics degree programme. His research interests include the genetics of autism and the biology of maternal-fetal interactions. His poetry has appeared in The Irish Examiner, The Moth, Southword and The Well Review. He won first prize in The Moth International Poetry Prize in 2012.



Victoria Kennefick is a poet, writer and teacher from Shanagarry, Co. Cork now based in Co. Kerry. She holds a doctorate in English from University College Cork and studied at Emory University and Georgia College and State University as part of a Fulbright Scholarship. Her pamphlet, White Whale (Southword Editions, 2015), won the Munster Literature Centre Fool for Poetry Chapbook Competition and the Saboteur Award for Best Poetry Pamphlet. She is a co-host of the Unlaunched Books Podcast and is on the committee of Listowel Writers' Week. She has just launched her debut collection, Eat Or We Both Starve, to widespread acclaim.

COLM'S CHOICE - JOIN RACHEL KUSHNER IN CONVERSATION WITH COLM TOÍBÍN

Join Colm and Rachel for a conversation exploring the intricacies of her latest novel and her adventures in pursuit of her passion for motorcycles.




Rachel Kushner is a writer celebrated for her 'chops, ambition, and killer instinct' (John Powers, Fresh Air). In *The Hard Crowd*, she gathers a selection of her writing from over the course of the last twenty years that addresses the most pressing political, artistic, and cultural issues of our times - and illuminates the themes and real-life terrain that underpin her fiction.



In nineteen razor-sharp essays, *The Hard Crowd* spans literary journalism, memoir, cultural criticism, and writing about art and literature, including pieces on Jeff Koons, Denis Johnson, and Marguerite Duras. Kushner takes us on a journey through a Palestinian refugee camp, an illegal motorcycle race down the Baja Peninsula, 1970s wildcat strikes in Fiat factories, her love of classic cars, and her young life in the music scene of her home town, San Francisco. The closing, eponymous essay is her manifesto on nostalgia, doom, and writing.

These pieces, new and old, are electric, phosphorescently vivid, and wry, and they provide an opportunity to witness the evolution and range of one of the world's most dazzling and fearless writers.



Colm Tóibín is the author of nine novels and two collections of stories and one of Ireland's most celebrated writers. His work has been translated into more than thirty languages. He is a contributing editor at the London Review of Books, the Irene and Sidney B. Silverman Professor of the Humanities at Columbia University, and Chancellor of Liverpool University. And, of course, we are delighted and proud that he is also the President of Listowel Writers' Week.




